Jeanette Gellard from Innovative Influences returned to Leigh Creek to facilitate a series of community workshops to help us plan for the town's future in a way that improves the township's livability, attractiveness and resilience.

Each workshop started by revisiting the Community Vision from early 2022 to check in if it is still relevant, and receiving a unanimous Yes!

Leigh Creek is an engaged, self-sustaining community that celebrates diversity and acknowledges its history, maintains a vibrant retail precinct and flourishing tourism sector that brings increased employment and business opportunities, and supports a quality of life that embraces wellbeing and creates a sense of belonging.

Each group spent some time using maps discussing how the town will look and function, looking towards how the newly created public spaces could be used and what amenities are needed for this to happen. What Town Signage is needed moving forward, which community assets are needed and exploring the future use. Finally mapping the community groups and how a collaborative approach can be achieved moving forward, including skills needed and resources to support good governance.

Participants also had the opportunity do a "Town Walk" and enjoy a yummy BBQ dinner held in the fabulous new community space.














































































Would you like to take part in our new Community Seed Swap? It's easy!


