

Minister visits the West Coast

Hon Geoff Brock MP, local Member for Stuart, Minister for Local Government, Regional Roads and Veterans Affairs visited several communities along South Australia's West Coast last month. Reflecting on his visit, Minister Brock emphasized, "This trip was about talking to local communities, listening to issues raised and seeing first-hand completed projects and ongoing works across the West Coast."

He met with Progress Association members and residents from Coorabie, Fowlers Bay and Penong, with discussions focused on local road conditions, water availability, waste management challenges and the condition of the Coorabie airstrip.

Following health challenges last year Minister Brock said it was a long-awaiting trip out west to meet people and hear their concerns. Expressing gratitude for the discussions, he remarked, "Thank you to all those who took the time to meet me and for their generous hospitality, and I look forward to working with the OCA to explore opportunities to improve the road network and other outback services."

The Outback Communities Authority and the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) have been working in partnership to establish a South Australian Outback Roads Consultative Forum.

Its purpose is to identify and prioritise critical road issues, provide input towards the development of policies and strategies for Outback SA's road network and deliver recommendations on the allocation of resources and targeted investments.

Comprising representatives from local communities, primary production, transport, tourism and mining sectors, the Forum will meet at least twice a year and provide regular updates to outback residents. At present, nominations are open for two representatives from our region - one from the west and another from the east of the Stuart Highway.
